What's it like? A 900-year-old manor house in the Oxfordshire countryside. Steeped in history, this is the place to go for a relaxed, quintessentially English getaway. Think floral teacups, huge fireplaces and glorious grounds.

Rooms any good? The carved four-poster bed with its comfy cushions ensured a good night's sleep – but if you're over 6ft you might struggle to fit in. The modern bathroom may not tie in with the rest of the historical decor, but was clean and sparkling.

Eat here or grab a pizza? The restaurant boasts a fine dining menu. Sit in the oak-panelled hall and delve into the menu by new head chef Larry Jayasekara who has

worked in top London restaurants. It costs £50 a head, but the food is of such a high quality it is well worth it.

What else? Bag a bargain at Bicester Village – an outlet mall with more than 130 shops – a five-minute drive away. Or head to Oxford for more individual boutiques in the covered market and browse around the colleges.

For a fun family day out, go to Woodstock and admire the beauty at Blenheim Palace too.

So you'd go back? Yes, definitely. The manor is a world away from the hustle and bustle of city life.

What's the damage? B&B starts at £215 per night. See themanorweston.com or call 01869 350 621.

WITH Wimbledon done and dusted, I won't be the only Brit digging their tennis racquet out of the cupboard to tune up their skills.

But if you've forgotten most of what you ever learned about SW19's beautiful game there is no better place for a masterclass, with little chance of rain stopping play, than Pine Cliffs resort on the Algarve.

The estate has a tree-lined garden, a breathtaking view of the Atlantic from the golf course, and five tennis courts.

The 215-room Sheraton Algarve hotel is just one of five different accommodation types on offer at the resort.

There are two and three-bedroom suites at the Pine Cliffs

Residence, which have kitchenettes to allow self-catering, and you can also rent, or even buy an entire villa, with the option to lease it out when you're not staying.

While that might be pricey, it's easy to see why visitors would find themselves wanting to return again and again.

The Annabel Croft Tennis Academy gives you a chance to get your old forehand back – or develop one for the first time if you're a beginner.

I book a one-to-one lesson with a friendly instructor, who doesn't seem to mind when I start my session by haplessly blasting shots over his head.

And despite the ten years since I last played a game, after work on my technique I start to think I might be getting better.

Before long I'm knocking the

ball back with ease – and fairly quickly as well. When my hour is up, I trudge out of the court exhausted, but pleased with myself.

It's not cheap, with ten private one-hour lessons priced at £465, but there's a more affordable – and more sociable – option at £286 for ten shared lessons.

Afterwards I admire the stunning sea views and stroll across the lovely lawns to the cliff-edge.

There I get in the resort's lift, which has a glass wall to allow you to look out over the ocean.

I head down a wooden walkway to gorgeous Falesia beach.

Sitting on the sand, I watch the waves crash in.

From May to September, the Water Sports Centre also offers kayaking, jet-skiing, and windsurfing, among other sea bound activities.

Heading inside after an awesome sunset, I check out one of the resort's six restaurants, the Jardim Gourmet.

My tiger prawns are incredible, and the starter and dessert are incredible as well. And the bill? Yep, incredible. At £51 for just one person I'm wincing, especially as I've not had any booze.

The Portulano bar is the perfect place to enjoy a drink, with huge screens showing sport, while comfy sofas allow you to sit and chat.

Next morning it's a sport switch as I take a golf lesson with former pro Manuel

GADGETS NEED SWITCH ON BEFORE TAKING FLIGHT

YOU are going to have to **TURN ON** when you turn up at UK airports.

The US security authorities were the first to demand ANY electronic devices must be able to power up before boarding US-bound flights.

Now the tests on mobiles, laptops and tablets have been expanded to cover other destinations.

It is understood that Apple and Samsung gadgets have been singled out for extra checks.

If you can't turn your gizmo on, it will not be allowed on board. While few of us would ever board a flight with a flat phone battery, the new directive sounds riddled with problems and will almost certainly lengthen queues in security.

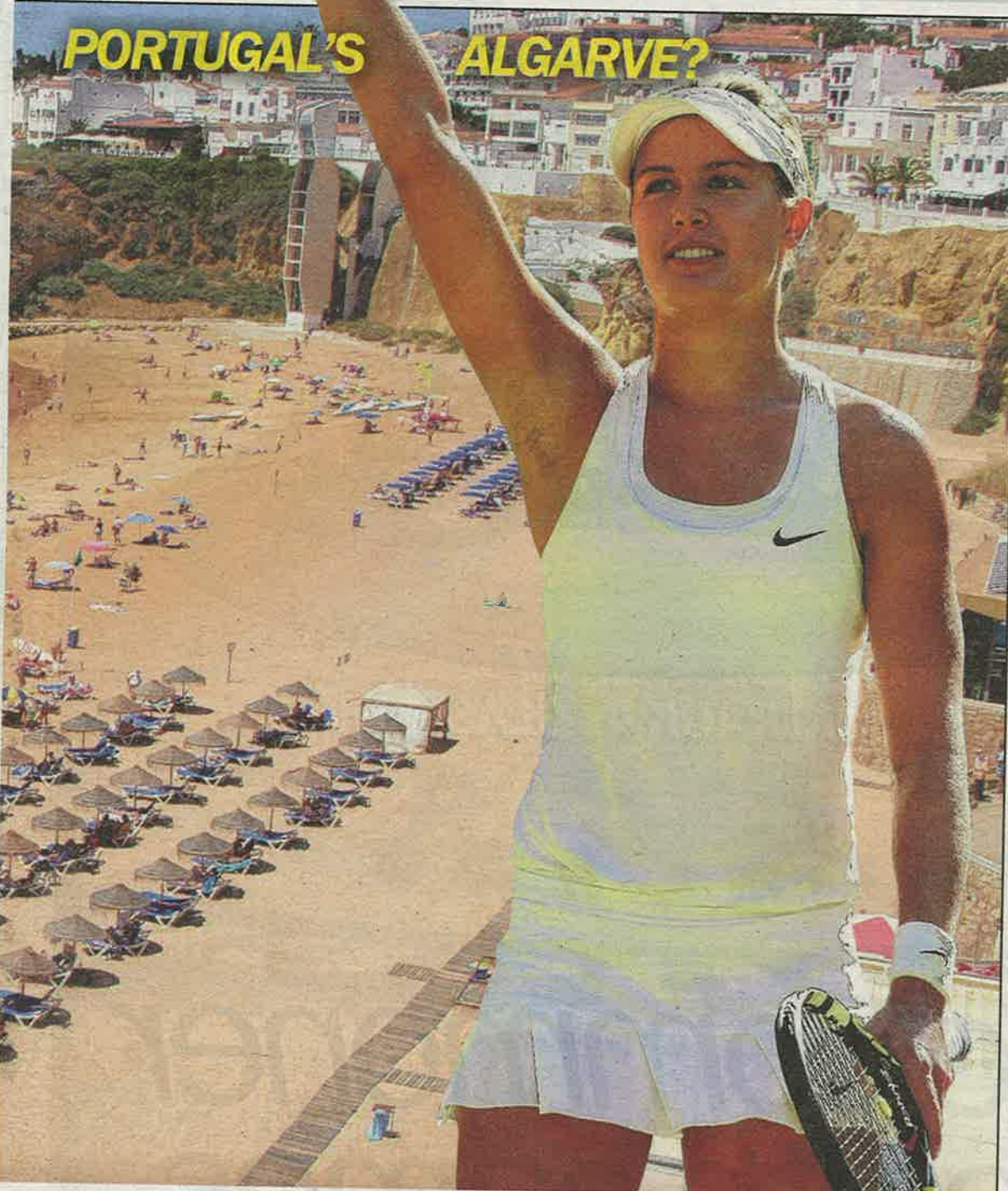

While I make rapid progress, I'm nowhere near good enough to tackle the nine-hole course.

But I can certainly testify to the breathtaking views from the fairways.

Taking advantage of the health facilities at Experience Wellness at Pine Cliffs, I book myself in for a vigorous Ayurveda massage.

And I enjoy a splash in the pool overlooking the sea, just one of FIVE outdoor pools.

Heading into one of the resort's two health clubs, I make a token effort on the weights before hopping into the

pool instead, and finally just sitting in the Jacuzzi and sauna. I don't have kids, but taking a look at what's on offer, I almost wish I did.

Then I'd be able to have a go on the pirate ship without getting any funny looks.

The oversized boat is the centrepiece of the kids' play area, flanked by a basketball court,

and an 18-hole mini golf course. A Junior Club lets the eight to 12-year-olds tackle activities like football, archery, and crafts.

Four days pass so quickly and it's soon time to head home – and chilling out in the sun has left me feeling on top of the world.

I'm so relaxed I can even deal with the bill – it comes to just over £300 for food and drinks over the course of my alcohol-free stay.

While this will definitely be a trip you'll want to make again and again, for most holidaymakers, it's much more likely to be the trip of a lifetime.

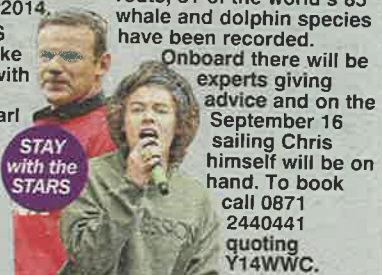
